Get to know your location

Look for signs of change

Moss growing on your wall could be the sign of a leaky gutter. Could a new crack in your wall be down to a tree close to the house growing too big?



Be aware of wear and tear

A slipped slate following a storm can lead to expensive damage if not spotted early. Signs of low level damp in your house could mean that your land drains have got filled with silt.



Plan ahead

Clear your gutters of leaves before winter sets in; give your woodwork a summer coat of paint.



Keep records

Retain informa on on methods and materials for any maintenance work you do; keep a track of any movement in any cracks in the building.



Work safely

Use personal protective equipment; make sure your ladders are well secured.

Builders with the right knowledge are often hard to find and get booked up. Is your building listed? If so, you might need Listed Building Consent for any repairs you need to make.
