## £1.7 million facelift for town centre

Seven areas of open space, including two car parks, within the town centre are to benefit from significant environmental improvements thanks to a successful funding bid by Torfaen County Borough to the Welsh Assembly Government and Welsh Development Agency.

The £1.7 million Town Centre Regeneration Scheme will be implemented over the next three years starting in April 2006 and will see a major transformation for the better in the town's physical appearance. The scheme tackles the most run-down and blighted areas of the town centre including Boot Lane, Broad Street Car Park and the area to the rear of the new public toilets on Lion Street. The proposals include providing attractive, high quality public spaces for resident and visitor enjoyment. Access to the town centre will be improved as will parking and disabled access. High quality materials including pennant sandstone paving and cast iron street furniture will be used and examples of public art incorporated into the design of some areas.



Executive Member for the Environment Councillor Neil Lewis said "This is great news for Blaenavon. This funding will enable much needed improvements in the town to be realised and will help to facilitate the continued economic and social regeneration of the town centre and wider World Heritage Site". Councillors Stuart Evans and Tom Huish were also delighted to have been awarded this funding and said 'It will make a huge difference to our town and we would like to thank the Blaenavon Regeneration Partnership, comprised of Blaenavon Town Council and Torfaen County Borough Council, who provided some of the funding to make this happen'.

## Christmas in Blaenavon St. Peters School transformed!

The festive season in Blaenavon got off to a glorious start on Monday 28th November when the town was lit by the Christmas Lantern Parade. One hundred children from St. Peters and Hillside Schools carried paper lanterns made by SWICA – the South Wales Intercultural Community Arts. Hundreds of people gathered for the traditional Blessing of the Crib ceremony at Bethlehem Court and to see the Christmas lights being turned on. Mayor of Blaenavon, Councillor Brian Whitcombe said "This years event has been



wonderful and what a joy it is to see so many young people participating in this annual event". After the ceremony, Santa Claus arrived at Bethlehem Chapel with gifts for local children kindly donated by the Blaenavon Traders and Tourist Association.

Work continues on the restoration of the former St. Peters School which will be converted into the Blaenavon World Heritage Centre, the first of its kind in the UK. Work began on the exterior of the building earlier this year which is now near completion. Once this is achieved work can begin on building the café area and link building which will connect the upper and lower school buildings.

The Heritage Centre will be the focal point for the World Heritage Site and will be a fun and educational place to visit to learn more about the 33,000 hectare site.

The Centre will combine video presentations and IT with more traditional displays to explain the different features that make up the World Heritage Site and give a history of the town. The centre will also be equipped with a study room, lecture room and meeting facilities which will be available to schools and community groups.

## Big Pit scoops top award

In May 2005 Big Pit: National Coal Museum beat three other short listed attractions to scoop the £100,000 Gulbenkian Prize for UK Museum of the Year, the UK's largest arts prize.

Big Pit was nominated for the Gulbenkian Prize following a £7 million refurbishment which was completed in February 2004. During that time all the colliery buildings were restored. The main exhibition which is held in the Baths tells the story not only of the coal mining industry, but also of the communities that grew as a result. On winning the prize Keeper and Mine Manager Peter Walker said "Big Pit is a special place to visit, and I'm delighted that the judges in this year's competition feel the same way as we do about the museum." Since winning the award the museum has had over 86,000 visitors, 8,000 more than during the same period last year. This year sees the museum opening throughout the winter for the first time allowing more visitors than ever to enjoy this unique attraction.

## It's all wrapped up!

Construction work on the first of two town centre commercial blocks has been completed. Neighbourhood Renewal Area funding from the Welsh Assembly Government has been used to carry out major renovation works to properties 32-39 Broad Street. The works, carried out by local company P & P Builders, have dramatically transformed this previously run down and derelict group of buildings.

New shop fronts based on those originally in place in the 1900's have been installed together with new roofs, windows and doors. Executive Member for the Environment Councillor Neil Lewis said "This is a tremendous achievement. The transformation in these buildings has been incredible and the improvements make a real difference to the town".

## Blaenavon Property Improvement Grant

The Blaenavon Regeneration Partnership has launched the Blaenavon Property Improvement Grant, which will provide funding for external improvements which enhance the appearance of the facades of commercial and community buildings.

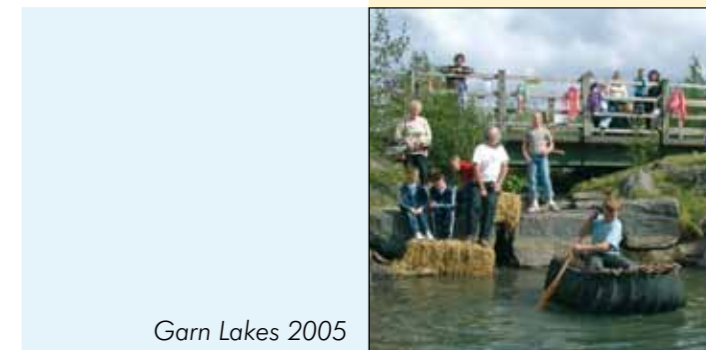
Blaenavon Project and Marketing Manager, Cath Thomas said "The purpose of the grant is to assist with the regeneration of the local economy by assisting traders and the community with the cost of carrying out improvements to their property". The grant is offered at a rate of up to 80% of eligible costs for commercial buildings up to a maximum of £1000. Community buildings will be offered up to 100% of eligible costs up to a maximum of £1000. As funds are limited, the grant will be offered on a first come first served basis. ## Fancy being a Volunteer Ranger?

World Heritage Site Warden, Alvin Nicholas has established a volunteer ranger service. Twenty people now regularly act as volunteers. More are needed however to take part in practical projects to restore and protect the historic landscape. A variety of projects are arranged for all abilities on a monthly basis. These vary from dry-stone walling to visitor monitoring and surveying, so whatever your interest, there will be something for you.

Training in subjects such as nature, history and practical countryside skills is provided and the group are supported by the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority, Monmouthshire County Council and British Trust for Conservation Volunteers.

It is hoped that this group will grow and will have a key role to play in changing peoples perceptions, visitor management and protection of the historic landscape.

A regular volunteer work day is held on every second Thursday of every month with Alvin and a warden from the Brecon Beacons National Park. You are welcome to attend. Meet at Riflegreen Car Park, Blaenavon, at 9.30a.m.
